Over the past year West Suffolk Hospital Foundation Trust, Suffolk GP Federation, Norfolk and Suffolk Foundation Trust and East Suffolk and North Essex Foundation Trust, commissioners and voluntary and community sector have worked together. Taking what healthcare professionals, the public and people who use services have told us, we have worked up proposals of how staff will work together in the future.

There are four areas which we need your feedback on. Community; children and young people's; learning disability and autism; and crisis services.

The feedback you give will be delivered before the decisions are made to help transform mental health and learning disability and autism services in east and west Suffolk.
