1. LD Pre-health Questionnaire

The CCG recently made available to you the learning disability pre health check questionnaire booklets. An <u>editable e-version of the questionnaire</u> is also available for patients who you feel may find it suitable. This year NHS England mandates that GP practices need to ensure as a minimum that 75% of their patients living with LD have a health check. 3. ESNEFT New Immunology Reference Intervals

Please read the <u>latest communication</u> from North East Essex and Suffolk Pathology Services (NEESPS), which advises that as from 1 August 2019 the Rheumatoid Factor will be assayed by Clinical Biochemistry at Ipswich Hospital and outlines the new reference interval.

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4. Dementia coding in GP Practice and Care Homes

There is a need to raise awareness of dementia coding in general practice and in our care homes. For patients in care homes who potentially have advanced dementia, the DIADEM tool has been approved for use by our local Later Life Consultant Psychiatrists, and supports GPs in diagnosing dementia in nursing homes, which is both appropriate and recognised as good medical practice. 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5. Adult safeguarding web page



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7. Funding available for training nurses new to general practice

To help practices in Suffolk and North East Essex, the Training Hub have agreed to fund the Fundamentals of General Practice Nursing course to all newly recruited nurses who do not have experience or skills in general practice. The course covers all the skills and knowledge required for the nurse to be general practice ready and is run over 12 weeks, usually involving 12 study days out of practice. The course is available at Anglia Ruskin University and it is hoped that it will also run at the University of Essex in October 2019.

The Department of Health and Social Care has recently published The Community Pharmacy Contractual Framework for 2019/20 to 2023/24. The new Community Pharmacy Contract, which has been aligned with the GP contract, comes into force from October. Supporting delivery for the NHS Long Term Plan, the framework sets out the introduction of new clinical services to develop and expand the role of community pharmacy across three key areas: prevention, urgent care and medicines safety, with community pharmacies further integrated as part of local Primary Care Networks in the way they deliver services.

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CHART OF THE WEEK


17. We are often asked for more comparative information to enable practices to know where they stand on a variety of indicators in comparison with other practices. Therefore, we publish a chart every week. Please let us know if there are any topics that you would find it useful for us to cover.

This week we are looking at Overall Experience of GP Surgery (from the 2019 national Patient Survey).

In the most recent GP Patient Survey Constable Country managed to improve their score for overall experience of their practice by a hugely impressive 16.3%. We spoke to Practice Manager Pete Keeble to gain insight into what the Practice has been doing to achieve this and the following are a summary of the method they have used.

- 1. Seek feedback however you can websites (Practice, Healthwatch, NHS Choices), in person, engagement events, Friends and Family cards, patients feedback forms, Parish Magazine articles, posters, TV screens, national survey, local surveys etc. Healthwatch are also very helpful in obtaining feedback from patients.
- 2. Ensure patients know that you want to know what works well and what can be improved.
- 3. Review feedback from patients with staff, GP Partners and your PPG to decide what specific actions can be taken to improve the patient experience.
- 4. Let patients know that you have listened communicate improvements via the Practice Website, Parish Magazines, Newsletters, Posters, 'You said, we did' cards and in person.
- 5. Critically, engage the whole team to help ensure that the overall patient experience actually delivered is continually improving.

So congratulations to Constable Country and to all of you for your continued commitment and hard work on behalf of your patients.
