

Dear Colleague,

We are aware that your organisation and/or staff members and/or GP practices may have recently received one or more vexatious emails sent by a GP speciality trainee in the East of England which makes reference to two of our GP educators. These have been sent to multiple individuals and organisations which contain distressing and unsubstantiated allegations predominantly about Dr Abigail Taylor and Dr Toni Munno.

We respect and value both Abi and Toni for all they have both done to support and help our trainees in their educator roles. They do not deserve to be on the receiving end of communications like this.

We wanted to make it absolutely clear that we find this style of communication completely unacceptable. We are working closely with the Lead Employer and other relevant organisations to manage this situation. No clinician should be subject to harassment and abuse through their educational role and we are doing all we can to bring this deeply upsetting situation to as rapid a close as possible.

We can confirm that HEE has already conducted a careful and comprehensive series of investigations into the original complaints made about Abi and Toni by this trainee and that they were not in any way substantiated.

Please can we ask you to forward this email to all the GP practices within your area, not to respond to these emails and, if possible, to block the sender.
