Ophthamolog y – Emergency On-Call Service	ESNEFT's Ophthalmology Department has been reviewing its emergency on-call service in response to the Covid19 pandemic and both Ipswich and Colchester hospitals will now run an emergency on-call service for ophthalmology patients. It will run from 8am to midnight, seven days a week. Emergency clinics will also run on both sites from 8am to 8pm Monday to Friday. At weekends the clinics will run from 11am to 5pm. From 8pm to midnight weekdays, and 8am to 11am, plus 5pm to midnight at weekends, there will be an off-site on-call service.

Diabetes	You can now encourage your patients to use the Ipswich Touch Test to assess diabetic foot sensitivity at home by carers or relatives. Studies have shown that it is highly concordant to the 10gm monofilament test used in your clinics (Sharma S et al. Diabetic Med. 2014. 31, 1100–1103). Smoking Cessation Campaign – Ask, Advise, Act.	As part of work across the respiratory portfolio, the CCG have been supporting Suffolk Public Health with their smoking cessation campaign and Stoptober.
	A key part of this is the Ask, Advise, Act (AAA) model where healthcare professionals are proactively encouraged to <u>ask</u> patients if they smoke/still smoke, <u>advise</u> them that there are many support routes and medication and then <u>act</u> by referring them to OnelifeSuffolk.
	This 3-minute film 30 seconds to save a life demonstrates the capacity and effectiveness of Very Brief Advice on smoking to change lives and access a CPD certificate from <b>The National Centre for Smoking Cessation and Training</b> (NCSCT).
