

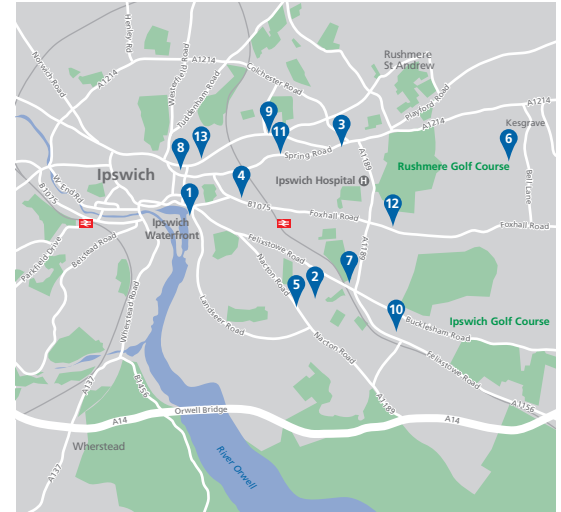
Your Ipswich pharmacy

Pharmacists are qualified health professionals and can advise you accordingly. You may not need to see a doctor, but can get helpful advice or buy a treatment for your condition. Ask your pharmacist first for advice about treating minor conditions

Look at www.nhs.uk for advice on how to stay well and reduce symptoms for minor conditions. Make sure you have enough of the medicine you need.

Local pharmacists

There is no need for an appointment; just pop in any time and they will be happy to help. If you are not sure whether your condition is minor or serious, speak to your pharmacist first - they will be able to advise if you need to see a doctor. Dental emergencies

If you require urgent treatment, please contact your usual dental practice as they may be able to see you or direct you to an urgent care dental service. If you do not have a regular dentist, contact NHS 111 for advice. Emergency dental treatment costs £19.70. You may be advised to make another appointment for a separate course of non-urgent treatment. In this case, you will have to pay a second charge in the relevant treatment band.

NHS 111

This can be used for a number of non-emergency reasons, such as an urgent, non-life threatening medical concern. Calls to 111 are free and the service is available 24/7. You'll speak to a trained call adviser and these are supported by experienced clinicians. They will ask you a series of questions to assess your symptoms and immediately direct you to the best medical care for you. People in life-threatening situations should still call 999.
